ANATOMICAL GIFT PROGRAM INSTRUCTION SHEET

On behalf of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas

- 1. The Willed Body Form should be signed and dated in the presence of two witnesses. If possible, one of the witnesses should be a member of the family. **It is <u>not</u> necessary to have the form notarized.** Make two copies of the form after it is signed and witnessed.
 - a. Return the *original signed* Willed Body Form to: Texas A&M School of Dentistry, Anatomical Gift Program, Department of Biomedical Sciences, 3302 Gaston Avenue, Dallas, TX 75246.
 - b. Give a copy of the signed Willed Body Form and these instructions to <u>two</u> people of your choice, such as a family member, friend, attorney, physician, minister, or funeral director, for the purpose of informing them of your bequest. Be sure they are familiar with these instructions.
 - c. A billfold card, indicating that you have willed your body to us, will be sent to you when we receive the original signed form.
- 2. Texas A&M School; of Dentistry will bear the expense of body preparation and transportation within a 250-mile radius of Dallas for an amount authorized by the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas. *Any additional expenses must be borne by the family.*
- 3. After use in the teaching and research programs, the bodies are cremated and placed in a vault at a local cemetery near Texas A&M School of Dentistry in accordance with Texas State Anatomical Board Regulations. However, if we are notified in writing that the family of the deceased requests the return of the cremated ash remains, we will comply with that wish. In that case, a name and address where the ash remains should be returned must be provided in the proper space on the Donation of Body Form; we must be notified of any subsequent changes of that address.

NOTIFYING THE WILLED BODY PROGRAM OF THE DEATH OF THE DONOR

To the family member or agent of the donor:

When death occurs, the Anatomical Gift Program at Texas A&M School of Dentistry should be notified immediately at 214-828-8276 so that appropriate arrangements can be made. Our phones are answered 24 hours a day 365 days a year.
